Partisan Politics

- “Let’s all hold hands and sing Kumbaya.”
NOT
- Federalists & Anti-Federalists
- 1798 Federalist Congress tries to suppress dissent with the Alien and Sedition Acts
- Brawl in Congress - Roger Griswold & Matthew Lyon

Jefferson

- Election of 1800 - Aaron Burr (36th ballot in the House of Representatives)
- Revolution of 1800 - simplicity
- Louisiana Purchase - \$15 million

Barbary Wars

- Mediterranean Trade Important
- Morocco, Algiers, Tunis, Tripoli demanded tribute
- U.S. paying \$50,000 a year
- Pasha of Tripoli declares war after Jefferson refused to pay more



Barbary Coast

War of 1812

- Indian conflicts led to conflicts with Britain and France
- Non-Intercourse Act intended to open up new trade routes
- War Hawks want war with someone - maybe Spain also to take Florida or Canada (because they are there)
- Quadruple size of the Army
- Congress (Southerners) declares war even after Britain agreed to stop search and seizure ships

- 2 1/2 years and Washington burns
- Battle of New Orleans
- Treaty of Ghent
- Know No one won



Monroe Doctrine

- Andrew Jackson invades Spanish Florida looking for Seminoles
- Executes two British subjects and declares himself governor of North Florida
- Monroe can't court-martial Jackson
- John Quincy Adams, secretary of State, negotiates treaty with Spain, we get Florida and we abandon all claims to Texas and Cuba

- When Spain tries to reclaim South American colonies who have declared independence, Monroe issues
- “The American Continents, by the free and independent condition which they have assumed and maintain, are henceforth not to be considered as subjects for future colonization by any European power.”
